Dear Parents and Community Members

This week the NAPLAN results have been released, it is important to remember that this test only takes into consideration the results of our students in one test on one day amounting to less than four hours, four times throughout a student's years of schooling. They do not however assess the skills or attributes of the students in other areas of interest such as sport, music or art. NAPLAN does however help parents and educators to see if children are meeting important numeracy and literacy standards, mapping progress but also identifying strengths and weaknesses in teaching programs. If parents or carers have any questions or concerns relating to the NAPLAN results please feel free to contact me through the school.

Today I had the opportunity to sit in and watch our students engage in the Southwest Arts "Threads of our Communities" program visit. Students were provided with the opportunity to take part in French or Tomboy Knitting and were able to create some masterpieces of their own. All students are to be commended in the way in which they actively and enthusiastically participated in the program.

In the coming weeks we will be introducing the Accelerated Reader program into the school. The Accelerated Reader is highly engaging and motivates students to read and improves their reading age and comprehension. From my past experience in using the program I believe it is highly effective and has proven results in improving students' reading and comprehension. Once students have completed reading a book, they take a short online quiz which provides both students and the teacher with immediate feedback towards their reading goals, improvement in reading and recommends available books that the student may be interested in.



How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "install".
- 4. The app is FREE to download.
- When installed click "Open"
- Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.





For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.



For Windows 81 Phone and Windows 81 or 10 device users:

- Go to the Windows Store on your 81 Windows Phone or Windows 81/10 Device
- 2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search
- 3. Install the Skoolbag app
- 4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
- 5. Click the "Pin" icon to pin the school tile to your Windows Phone home screen.
- Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup"
- Toggle the Push Categories that are applicable to you by tapping the on/off switch.

Please Note: The Skoolbag Windows App is for 8.1 version Windows Phones, or Windows 81 and 10 devices.

2016 CWA Awareness Week 3-10 September: highlighting the impacts of poor internet connectivity on health, education and crime

What: The Country Women's Association (CWA) of NSW's Ivanhoe branch is launching its

annual Awareness Week campaign, to be held from 3-10 September 2016.

This year, CWA Ivanhoe branch, along with the 400 other CWA branches across NSW, have chosen to highlight the significant impact a lack of connectivity is having on their community.

CWA Ivanhoe branch believe a lack of internet connectivity is severely hindering people's ability to conduct business, as well as access education and healthcare — specifically mental health services — and can contribute to higher crime rates in regional and rural areas.

Why: The digital age is well and truly upon us, but unfortunately our district is not seeing

the benefits. A lack of connectivity results in barriers to growth for our farmers and small business operators; barriers to a quality education for our students; and

barriers to health services for our entire community.

While 78% of NSW regional residents love living in their community, they cite critical infrastructure, including telecommunications, as being under serviced. Only 37% of rural and regional Australians have good access to high-speed internet, with regional NSW being the worst. Across rural and regional Australia, 46% report poor access to mental health services and half (50%) have poor access to specialist health services.

CWA of NSW is assisting journalists with examples of the difficulties faced by country people in relation to such impacts. Contact one of our local members if you wish to contribute.
