

# **Hea**lthy Lunch Box recipe

Zucchini muffins



#### Ingredients

2 zucchinis, grated & liquid squeezed

- 1 carrot, grated 125g tin corn kernels, drained
- 1 small red onion, finely diced cup baby spinach leaves, chopped
- 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
- 1 cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated

Preheat oven to 180°C. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with muffin liners

Heat a non-stick frypan over medium heat and cook the onion until translucent. Allow to cool.

Place all ingredients into a large mixing bow and mix until well combined.

Divide the mixture between the 12 muffin liners. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins are golden and a skewer comes out clean.
